Notes and Observations from Library Director, Greg Needham

As we make our way through the first quarter of 2015, I would like to remind you all what a positive difference the Friends of the Sheppard Memorial Library make every year for the library and for our entire community. Here are just a few of the improvements and enhancements being implemented at your library, which would not have been possible without the Friends of SML's support:

- **I.** We started 2015 with the addition of self-checkout stations at the East, Winterville and Carver branches. This was part of a federal LSTA grant project, for which the Friends provided the matching funding. Each month, between 10 and 15 percent of total circulation of books and other materials are checkouts from the one self-check station at the main library. We are very excited to now be able to offer this option for our patrons at Carver, East and Winterville as well.
- **2.** Lighting has been installed to illuminate the beautifully renovated aluminum sign outside the Evans Street entrance to the Main Library. The Friends of SML funded both the sign renovation and lighting. The enhancement really has dressed up the appearance of the original entrance.

- **3.** The Main Library computer lab is installed, and we are replacing the remainder of the public computers at the Main Library, also through an LSTA grant with Friends matching funding. In addition, the Literacy Volunteers of Pitt County are now offering a variety of free computer classes in the lab, which would not have been possible without the lab setup.
- **4.** The list of Friends-supported enhancements goes on, including annual support of the Quiz Bowls, Summer Reading Program, additions to the book collection, and more!

The funding from the Friends of SML is vitally important and it takes countless volunteer hours to produce that funding, which comes directly from the book sales each year. This year's annual book sale, held February 5-8, raised more than \$32,000.

In addition to raising money for programs, computers self-check outs and more, the book sale helps to get more books back into the community and in the hands of readers. We are truly thankful for all of our Friends and for everything you do in support of your public library!




Thanks to all the teams and coaches for participating in this event and to the moderator, judges, rotation authority, and Sheppard Memorial Library staff members who assisted with the competition.


